BULLETIN FLASHBACKS

(Enjoy the history)

September 30, 1962: School Milk: Twenty-two school days in October points to a 44-cent milk bill for children at East Primary and West Elementary. It really saves the teacher valuable school time if parents can put the 44 cents for each child into an envelope, then mark the child's name, the amount enclosed, and "milk" on the outside of the envelope. Thanks for your patience and your kind cooperation.

October 1, 1978: prayers for the deceased Holy Father, Pope John Paul I should be a part of each person's life this week. For the second time in two months, we are saddened by the death of our chief shepherd. First and always a pastor, Pope John Paul I, Albino Luciani, was a noted scholar, and termed himself, "a little man accustomed to little things and silence." Pope John Paul I was 65 years old when elected pope on August 26, and invested on September 3, of this year. His is the shortest reign of any pope for many centuries. During these days we can use the daily recitation of the rosary as a time for public prayers for the repose of his soul, and for the guidance of the Church as it selects his successor.

October 7, 1984: The annual October count of those attending Mass and those receiving Holy Communion will begin this weekend. Ushers are asked to count those attending Mass, the servers are to count those receiving Holy Communion.

"October Count" is an important piece of info which the Archdiocese uses in allocating the assignment of priest.

SHARING OUR FAITH WITH OTHERS: On Evangelization in the Modern World, apostolic exhortation of Pope Paul VI: #59, If people proclaim in the world the Gospel of salvation, they do so by the command of, in the name of and with the grace of Christ the Savior. "They will never have a preacher unless one is sent,"[81] wrote he who was without doubt one of the greatest evangelizers. No one can do it without having been sent.

But who then has the mission of evangelizing?

The Second Vatican Council gave a clear reply to this question: it is upon the Church that "there rests, by divine mandate, the duty of going out into the whole world and preaching the gospel to every creature." [82] And in another text: "...the whole Church is missionary, and the work of evangelization is a basic duty of the People of God." [83]

We have already mentioned this intimate connection between the Church and evangelization. While the Church is proclaiming the kingdom of God and building it up, she is establishing herself in the midst of the world as the sign and instrument of this kingdom which is and which is to come. The Council repeats the following expression of St. Augustine on the missionary activity of the Twelve: "They preached the word of truth and brought forth Churches." [84]
